FAMILIES IN CRISIS

Intact Family Services (IFS) is ECFA's largest program but often the least understood. Our staff provides case management services to families who have been investigated by the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS). In most cases, one or both parents have been "indicated" for abuse or neglect of one or more of the children in their home. This means that there is evidence to substantiate the report of maltreatment. DCFS makes referrals to ECFA to provide intensive, in-home services to these families. Our goal is to ensure the ongoing safety of the children and to prevent them from being placed into foster care.

Intact Family Services focuses on at-risk situations because children may remain in the home with the perpetrator. High levels of stress in these families and the lack of support can result in incidents of abuse and neglect. In some cases, single mothers in the program try to care for their children while struggling financially. Frequently, they lack an adequate support system to rely upon. We can only imagine what it would be like not being able to call one's parent or other family members for help when it is needed.

This year the IFS program has seen a much higher percentage of homeless families than usual. These families may reside in shelters, hotel rooms, or in overcrowded housing with friends or relatives who have temporarily allowed them to reside with them. Many parents also lack transportation which makes it difficult to get to appointments, attend recommended services, go grocery shopping, or utilize

other community resources such as food pantries and job training. It is common for an IFS client to be a single parent with limited resources, unstable housing, and transportation barriers which make the already difficult job of parenting even more stressful. These parents have to figure out how to take their children to medical appointments, go grocery shopping with their kids in tow, look for jobs, and accomplish difficult tasks that are routine in two-parent households.



Helping these families can be very challenging due to the barriers to services and lack of support these parents experience. IFS case managers do all they can for their clients within limited time constraints. It would be so helpful to these families if there were more resources available for transportation and other issues. They most certainly need encouragement and practical means of support.

"Emily" (not her real name) loves all her children and wants to be the best mom she can be for them. One child has significant medical needs. Due to a lack of self-confidence and her own trauma history, she has shut down emotionally when at her child's medical appointments. This behavior was perceived by medical professionals as Emily not listening or caring, but that is far from the case.

Instead, Emily's anxiety was so profound that she had a great deal of difficulty understanding anything the doctors were telling her. Her IFS caseworker identified the problem and began attending appointments with her. Emily was also referred for counseling at ECFA. Her counselor attended appointments with her as well, and helped her work through her fears and anxiety. Now Emily feels more confident speaking with medical professionals, making appointments, and is consistent in attending services for her children. We found that Emily is not a mom who does not care, but one who needs supportive people in her life.



We are looking for mentors to come alongside young parents like Emily as well as volunteers to take them to various appointments. We would welcome any assistance to help us serve parents and children in our community.
