SINCE 1983 APRIL HAS BEEN DECLARED "CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH"

You may ask, what can I do to prevent child abuse/neglect? First, pray. Secondly, if you suspect a child is being abused or neglected, call the Illinois hotline number: 1-800-25-abuse. You can remain anonymous.

BUT, there's more. Many children who have been removed from their home due to abuse or neglect have not achieved permanency after two or more years of being "in the system". You may ask, "Why"? Often it is because the parents did not engage in services to correct the condition(s) that brought their child(ren) into foster care. Many children do get placed with relatives when they enter foster care, and the children remain with them if they cannot return home. Also if children get adopted by their nonrelated foster parents. BUT some children are not fortunate enough to return to rehabilitated parents, be placed with appropriate

relatives, or be adopted by their foster parents with whom they have established an attachment. UNLESS adoptive families step forward to adopt these children, they will grow up in the foster care

system; never experiencing a permanent home where they can call someone "mom and dad".

One Church, One Child was formed in the 1980's when the Rev. George Clements, pastor of Chicago's Holy Angels Catholic Church, adopted a boy name Joey. The focus of the organization

was dedicated to recruit at least one family from every African American church in the nation to adopt a child. If every Bible believing church became dedicated to that goal, there would be no more "waiting children" in foster care. Many churches have become involved by: A) creating an orphan ministry in the church, B) families either fostering or adopting children of all ages, C) creating an adoption fund to help defray adoption expenses for a family, or D) providing a support group ministry for the adoptive and foster families in their church.

NEW VOLUNTEER DRIVER PROGRAM

ECFA is launching a ground-breaking volunteer driver program in DuPage County! Transportation within DuPage County is very challenging.

Unreliable transportation creates a significant hurdle for our clients. Missing essential services and appointments, or facing the financial strain of costly ride-shares, directly impacts their ability to access the support that they need.

You can provide a lifeline by offering rides to the grocery store, food pantry, medical



appointments etc. Some needs are weekly, but some may be twice or even once a month.

The Early Days of ECFA

In the 1940's Chicago area believers became increasingly aware of and concerned for the many neglected and dependent children in the city. A group of people began to meet to discuss the establishment of an agency to address these needs. Reverend and Mrs. Sholund, of Winnetka Bible Church, Mr. Penner of the National Association of Evangelicals, and Dr. Harold Lundquist, met and decided to take action. Around the same time, two significant events spurred them on to open an evangelical agency in the Chicago area. The first event was a foster child being removed from the home they were placed in because the case worker felt the child "would have too many strikes against them" due to the evangelical home environment. The second event occurred April of 1945 when an abandoned baby was found at the door of a Moody Bible Institute dormitory.

The Evangelical Welfare Agency (EWA) was established in 1950. Rev. Milford Sholund was the first Executive Director and Della Cain was the first case worker. The first office was located at 542 S. Dearborn St. in Chicago.

In 1959 EWA became Evangelical Child Welfare Agency (ECWA), and in 1974, was renamed Evangelical Child and Family Agency (ECFA), as it is still known today. In 1981, after 31 years of rented facilities, ECFA moved from their downtown location, though an office building was maintained at 188 W. Randolph, to their own building at 1530 N. Main Street, Wheaton, IL, where the office still exists.

A women's Auxiliary was formed under the sponsorship of Mrs. Dorothy Kelley who also began working at EWA in 1951. This women's Auxiliary played an integral part in the growth of EWA. The almost 2000

women who were part of the Auxiliary supplied clothing and other supplies to the agency and raised funds to support the agency.

In October of 1962 the Auxiliary saved enough S & H green stamps (987 books) to purchase a brand-new Chevy II. If you never heard of S & H Green Stamps, I encourage you to check it out on Google.

There is more history to share with you, but I will end this for now with these encouraging words: ECFA began as a ministry to honor and serve our Lord Jesus Christ. It remains that to this day. We covet your prayers as we continue to serve clients as the "Hands and Feet of Jesus".
